- Annual Tuition Fees incorporate most components of the compulsory curriculum.
- Year Level charges cover expenses incurred specific to each year group.
- The School will charge GST where applicable.

SIBLING DISCOUNT

Sibling discounts are offered for siblings attending both Parkerville Steiner College and Silver Tree Steiner School, as well as both Parkerville Steiner College and Perth Waldorf School (Class 12).

The following discounts apply to tuition fees only, for siblings attending the school concurrently. All other fees and charges must be paid in full.

Second Child	15%

APPLICATION FEE

A non-refundable application fee of \$100 is payable with a completed Application Form. Payment of the application fee does not guarantee an interview or allocation of a place in the school.

ENROLMENT FEE

An offer of a place in the school needs to be secured with a non-refundable enrolment fee of \$500.

HIGH SCHOOL HOLDING DEPOSIT

A student currently enrolled in a Steiner Primary School who is intending to attend the PWS/PSC High School will be asked to pay a Holding Deposit of \$450 to secure their place. This will be refunded on the commencement of Term 2, Class 7.

ASSOCIATION MEMBERSHIP FEES

All families with children enrolled in the school are members of the School Association. A fee for this is charged with the annual school fee invoice. As a member of the Association families have voting rights at the school AGM and can nominate to be on the School Council. The Association fee is used directly to pay for membership and services provided by Steiner Education Australia (SEA) and the Association of Independent School WA (AISWA).

PAYMENT OF FEES

Annual Fee invoices will be provided at the start of each school year. Payments can be made throughout the year in a number of ways:

- a) In full in one payment
- b) Termly, with the termly amount due by the second Friday of each term. To arrive at the termly amount you need to divide the annual invoice by four.
- c) Weekly, Fortnightly or Monthly, with the fees being paid in full by Friday the 23rd of October 2026.

LATE PAYMENT OF FEES

Parents/Guardians who are unable to pay fees by the due date must notify the Accounts department.

The school reserves the right to charge a late fee of \$25 for any accounts that fall into arrears.

Collection costs (including, but not limited to, court fees and charges, legal fees, and agent's commissions) associated with action taken for the recovery of outstanding fees will be charged to fee accounts.

The School reserves the right to deny entry to any child into the next term if fees are outstanding.

NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL

Notice of 10 term weeks must be given via the Exit Form (which is available on the website) prior to the withdrawal of a student.

If less than 10 weeks notice is given, families will be invoiced a late fee equivalent to 10 weeks of tuition fees. The notice period is calculated from the date the Exit form is received by the school.

HOLDING OF PLACES

If a parent wishes to withdraw a student for **one term only** and wishes to retain the student's place, the full fees for that term will be charged. Any requests for holding of place must be made in writing to the PSC Head of School.

FAMILY PARTICIPATION SCHEME (FPS)

Families are to submit the FPS Form showing 10 hours of participation each semester. \$100 per semester will be charged to the family account as part of the annual school fee invoice. If the form is returned by the due date, this amount will be credited back.

BUILDING FUND LEVY

Contributions from parents and friends to the building fund support the school's infrastructure, growth and development. All donations over \$2.00 to the Building Fund are tax-deductible. At present \$400 per family is billed annually.

ACCIDENT INSURANCE & AMBULANCE COVER

The school has no insurance to cover students for accidents, etc. Therefore, we strongly encourage all parents to take out personal cover for their child/children.

BURSARIES – TEMPORARY, LIMITED FEE RELIEF

From time-to-time, families may be unable to meet their fee commitments due to unforeseen circumstances. Temporary, limited assistance may be available to these families. BOOKLISTS

Booklist items supplied by the school will be invoiced to families.

MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS

All students in Class 7 to Class 10 receive small group tuition in a musical instrument. Parents are responsible for the hire or purchase of the musical instrument played.

CAMP FEES

Camps are an integral and compulsory part of the school curriculum from Class 7 to Class 12. Exceptions will only be made with a valid Medical Certificate, with at least 1 months' notice or on compassionate grounds with the approval of the Head of School. Camp fees will vary depending on location. Estimated costs are included in the annual school fee invoice, but adjustments may be made once the camp has been completed.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Students from Class 7 to Class 10 will be invoiced for participation in Physical Education classes. This cost is a contribution toward the cost of running a large proportion of this program in external venues.

CLASS 11 AND 12 ELECTIVES

Certain elective subjects in Class 11 and Class 12 will attract a separate charge, such as Physical Education and Outdoor Education. These charges will be invoiced once the students have confirmed their subjects.

EXTRACURRICULAR SPORTS

A small cost is incurred for students who elect to participate in Extra-curricular or Interschool sports. This cost will be invoiced separately to families.
